

# CD Clock Radio

User's Guide for Model CC314B v958-02



## Important Safety Instructions

- Read these Instructions.
- Keep these INSTRUCTIONS.
- Heed all Warnings.
- Follow all instructions.
- Do not use this apparatus near water.
- Clean only with a dry cloth.
- Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. 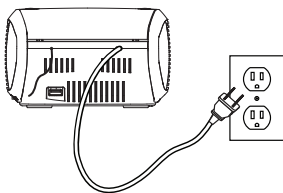

## FEATURES AND CONTROLS

### Power

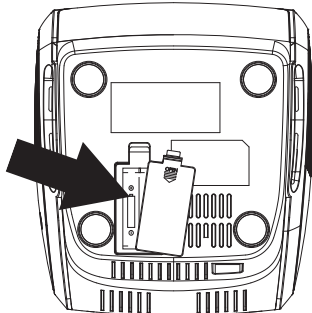
To power the unit, plug the built-in AC Power cord into a standard wall outlet.



### Battery Backup

Requires 2, AAA-size, batteries (not included).

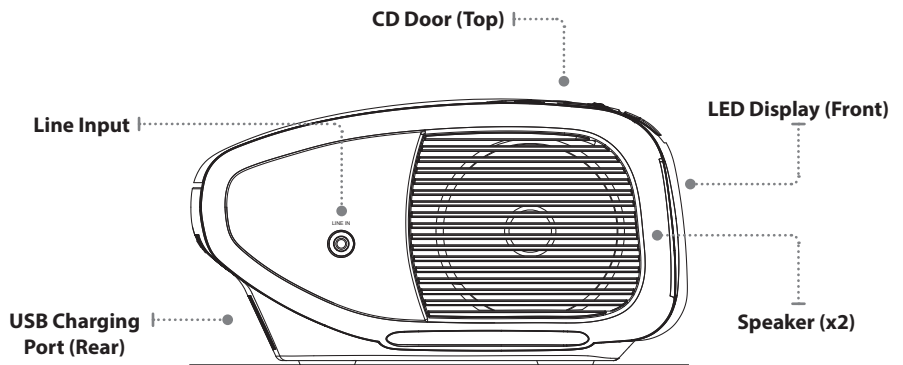
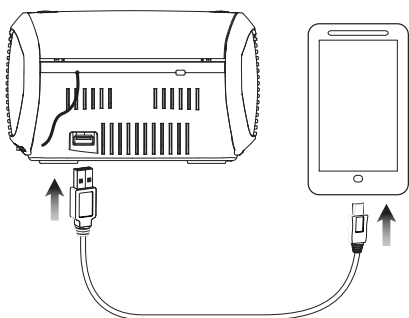
The battery backup is intended for short power outages only. The clock radio's primary functions cannot run off of the battery backup alone.



### Charging Connected Devices

Requires USB cable (not included).

The USB Charging Port on the rear of the unit can be used to charge mobile devices as seen below.



**Skip/Search/Tune +/-**  
Press to skip between tracks on a loaded CD. Press and hold search through the current track. In Radio mode, press to tune the radio. Press and hold to search for the next available station.

**Clock Set**  
In Off mode, press and hold to begin setting the time.

**Volume/AL1/AL2**  
Press to adjust the volume. Press & hold to begin setting Alarm 1 or Alarm 2.

**Open/Close**  
Press to open or close the latch on the CD door.

**Source**  
Press to switch between Radio, Line In, and CD modes.

**Repeat/Program**  
In CD Play mode, press to repeat the current track. Press twice to repeat the entire album. In CD Stop mode, press to program a loaded CD to play tracks in a specified order.

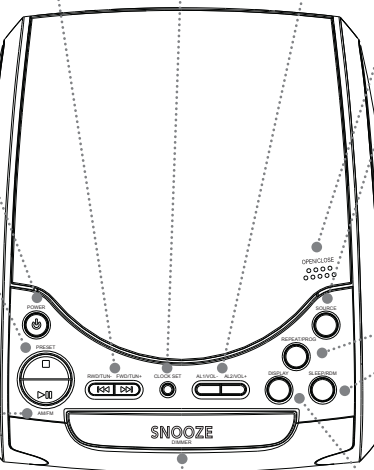
**Sleep/Random**  
In On mode, press repeatedly to set the sleep timer. In CD Play mode, press & hold to play tracks from a loaded CD in a random order.

**Display**  
Press to view the time in Radio or CD mode.

**Power**  
Press to turn the unit on or off.

**Stop/Presets**  
Press to stop a CD during play. Press & hold to begin saving the current station as a preset.

**Play/Pause/AM/FM**  
Press to play or pause a loaded CD. Press to switch between AM radio and FM radio.



**Snooze/Dimmer**  
Press to delay the alarm for several minutes. Press to adjust the brightness of the display.

---

## CLOCK AND SLEEP TIMER

---

### Setting the Clock

1. Press the **Power** button to turn the unit off.
2. Press and hold the **Clock Set** button until the display begins to blink, then release the button.
3. Press the **Tune +/-** buttons to adjust the hour. *Note the PM indicator will light when the hour is set in the PM.*
4. Press the **Clock Set** button.
5. Press the **Tune +/-** buttons to adjust the minute.
6. Press the **Clock Set** button to finish setting the time.

### Setting the Sleep Timer

1. Press the **Power** button to turn the unit on.
2. Press the **Sleep/Random** button to set the sleep timer (90, 60, 30, 15 min or OFF).
3. Once the set sleep time has expired the clock radio will automatically power off.

---

## ALARM

---

### Setting the Alarm

1. Press the **Power** button to turn the unit off.
2. Press and hold the **AL1** or **AL2** button until the display begins to blink, then release the button.
3. Press the **Tune +/-** buttons to adjust the hour. *Note the PM indicator will light when the hour is set in the PM.*
4. Press the **AL1** or **AL2** button.
5. Press the **Tune +/-** buttons to adjust the minute.
6. Press the **AL1** or **AL2** button.
7. Press the **Tune +/-** buttons to switch between Buzzer, Radio and CD. The display will indicate the following:  
**rAd** for Radio, **bU** for Buzzer, and **Cd** for CD.
8. Use the **Vol+/-** buttons to adjust the volume of the alarm, except when set to Buzzer.
9. Once the set alarm time is reached, the alarm will sound.
10. To set the other alarm, follow the above steps and choose the alarm not currently set.

### Snooze and Alarm Reset

After the alarm sounds:

Press the **Snooze/Dimmer** button to delay the alarm for several minutes.

OR

Press the **Power** button to turn the alarm off until the set alarm time is reached again.

### Disabling the Alarm

Press the **AL1** or **AL2** button until the indicator is no longer lit. The alarm is not off and will not sound.

---

## LINE IN

---

### Using the Audio Input

Requires a 3.5mm audio cable (not included).

1. Connect a 3.5mm audio cable to the **Line In Input** on the side of the unit and the **audio output** on an audio device.
2. Press the **Power** button to turn the unit on.
3. Press the **Source** button to switch to **Line In mode**.
4. Use the native controls on the connected device to play your audio through the unit.

## CD

---

*Note: This unit is not compatible with MP3 CDs.*

### Loading and Playing a CD

1. Open the **CD Door**.
2. Place a CD into the unit, label side facing up.
3. Close the **CD Door**.
4. Press the **Source** button to switch to CD mode.
5. Press the **Play/Pause** button to begin playing the loaded CD.

### Programming a CD

1. Press the **Stop** button to stop the CD during play.
2. Press the **Program** button.
3. **"PROG"** will begin to blink on the display.
4. Press the **Tune +/-** buttons to select a track.
5. Press the **Program** button to save the selected track to the program.
6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 to program up to 20 tracks.

---

## RADIO

---

### Radio Reception

Extend the **FM Antenna** to improve FM radio reception. An AM antenna is built into the clock radio. To improve AM radio reception, adjust the position of the clock radio.

### Tuning the AM or FM Radio

1. Press the **Power** button to turn the unit on.
2. Press the **Source** button to switch to **Radio mode**, then press the **AM/FM** button to select the desired frequency band.
3. Press the **Tune +/-** buttons to adjust the radio to the desired frequency.
4. Press and hold the **Tune +/-** buttons to search for the next available frequency.
5. Press the **Vol+/-** buttons to adjust the volume.
6. Press the **Power** button to turn the radio off.

### Saving and Playing a Station as a Preset

1. Tune to the desired frequency.
2. Press & hold the **Preset** button.
3. The display will flash.
4. Press the **Tune +/-** buttons to set as P01 - P10.
5. Press the **Preset** to finish setting the station as a preset.
6. Press the **Stop/Preset** and **Tune +/-** buttons to cycle through preset radio stations.
